Helen Webber, it is the true story of a mother's search for inner
strength to help her overcome the devastating loss of a child.

entrance to her home, she goes through a profound period of
grief and self-exploration. Ultimately, it is a journey that leads
her back to a place of renewed joy and peace in her heart.
